A prohibited matter or restricted matter permit remains in force, unless sooner suspended or cancelled, for the term of not more than 3 years decided by the chief executive and stated in the permit.

The applicant will be notified of the outcome within 30 days of submitting the application, provided all the correct information has been received with the prescribed fee unless you are eligible for a fee waiver. The applicant will be notified by post to the applicant's postal address if you have not provided an email.

The *Biosecurity Act 2014* (section 231) requires that the chief executive must keep a register of prohibited and restricted matter permits. The register must contain the following three particular items for each permit:

- The name of the permit holder;
- The term of the permit and its expiry date; and
- The type of permit.

The *Biosecurity Act 2014* (section 231(3)) requires that the register of prohibited and restricted matter permits must be published on the department's website, www.daf.qld.gov.au showing the three particular items.

Permit conditions

A restricted matter/prohibited matter permit is subject to the conditions decided by the chief executive when granting an application as appropriate having regard to the restricted matter/prohibited matter and the nature of the dealing with the restricted matter/prohibited matter, the biosecurity risk and the ways stated in the permit plan to minimise the biosecurity risk.

Mandatory permit conditions are:

- The holder of the permit must allow an authorised officer to enter premises where the dealings under the permit are being undertaken to monitor the dealings and the holder's compliance with the permit and the Act in relation to the dealings; and
- Other conditions prescribed by a regulation.

Other conditions included in the permit may be about any of the following:

- Required level of containment;
- Scope of the permitted dealings;
- Disposal of the prohibited or restricted matter;
- Record-keeping requirements;
- Reporting requirements;
- Whether the permit may be transferred.
