

New quota and reporting requirements checklist

for fishers using paper logbooks from 1 September 2021

Before you go fishing:

- Familiarise yourself with the new legislation and reporting requirements for your fisheries.
- Read the Automated Interactive Voice Response (AIVR) system quick guide to understand the new AIVR reporting processes for your fisheries.
- Check and record your commercial fisher licence (CFL) number and CFL PIN, and your primary commercial fishing licence (PCFL) number and PCFL PIN. These details will be required for you to access and report through the AIVR system.
- Set up your 'favourite' species in FishNet Secure to streamline your AIVR call flow. See the AIVR fact sheet for further information.
- Check your quota balance for relevant individual transferable quota (ITQ) fishery. If you operate in the mud crab fishery, check your 1.2 tonne mud crab eligibility.
- Make a list of your landing place codes and transport vessel codes (for transshipment notices).

During a fishing trip:

- Keep a copy of the AIVR quick guide handy.
- Note the AIVR phone number.
- Keep a list of your landing place codes and transport vessel codes.
- Carry your logbooks with you on your fishing trips at all times, including:
 - catch and effort logbook/s
 - threatened, endangered and protected animal logbook
 - shark and ray logbook, if you are operating in the net or line fisheries
 - catch disposal record logbook, if you are operating in a quota fishery.
